

Procedure for Notification of Environmental Incidents

Effective 6 February 2012 the occupier of premises, the employer or any person carrying on the activity which causes a pollution incident is required to immediately notify each relevant authority (identified below) when material harm to the environment is caused or threatened.

Call 000 if the incident presents an immediate threat to human health or property. Fire and Rescue NSW, the NSW Police and the NSW Ambulance Service are the first responders, as they are responsible for controlling and containing incidents.

Otherwise, assess the risk of the incident and determine whether it can be controlled onsite either using emergency response equipment (e.g. fire extinguishers, fire hoses, spill kits etc.) or using the services of TPI Spill response 1800 SPILLS (1800 774 557). Each incident type will have its own response requirements as discussed in the site Emergency Response Plan. If possible, use the emergency response equipment onsite and manage the incident.

If the incident does not require an initial combat agency or once the 000 call has been made and the incident cannot be controlled by site personnel or if the incident has the potential to cause harm to humans, property or the environment, site management will contact the following authorities immediately:

- the EPA - phone Environment Line on 131 555
- the Ministry of Health via the local Public Health Unit – 9840 3603 after hours 02 9845 5555 (Westmead Hospital) - ask for Public Health Officer on call
- the WorkCover Authority – phone 13 10 50
- Fire and Rescue NSW – phone 000.
